

Oak, English

Quercus robur

- Large, deciduous, shade tree
- Rounded and broad crown
- 50' to 70' tall
- Branching is upright and spreading
- Young trees are typically pyramidal
- Moist, fertile well-drained soil preferred

- Relatively small leaves for an oak
- 2" to 5" long
- Color is dark green, olive green or blue-green
- Leaves remain green late into autumn
- Leaves drop green or turn brown, persist into winter

- Acorns borne singly or in clusters up to five; 0.6" to 1" long

- Bark has gray black color
- Bark has furrows and ridge

- Tree needs room to develop
