Elm American, White Elm

Ulmus americana

- Large, deciduous tree
- Three distinct habits:
 - 1. vase-shaped (most common)
 - 2. "oak-like" broad and wide spreading
 - 3. narrow with numerous branches covering trunk, columnar
- 60' to 90' tall
- Medium growth rate
- Prefers moist, fertile soil
- Leaf size varies from 3" to 6" long
- Leaf surface is rough
- Dark green leaf color turns yellowish-brown in fall
- Bark is dark gray in color with deep ridges
- Ridges crisscross, showing different layers of bark color
- Dutch Elm Disease has nearly wiped out species in North America
- Aphids are another problem
