Town is paying for storage unit for equipment presently as well as insurance (\$3,000).

Membership avg has been about \$7200 annually, Up to \$12,000 this year, with significant donations by a few members.

Major expenses \$6500, tools and Billy Goat.

Completion of determination of budget will be discussed at the March meeting.

- Connectivity Sub-Committee /AARP Grant meeting with Brian Emelson on 2/21 to discuss feasibility & costs for some proposed projects (Few suggestions: way finding signs; public toilet; extended sidewalk along School St.)

- Permanent VHT storage update: a few sites remain possibilities, but no decision at this time (Annual Goal #1)
- Electric Equipment purchase update-still need to purchase electric chain saw
- By-laws committee work ongoing (Annual Goal #4)
- Veterans hike Saturday AM May 3
- Trail work with Fleet Feet May 25th

NEW BUSINESS:

- Proposed ramp on Auburn between School & Maple (Annual Goal #3) to make trail disability compliant, considerable work involved reviewed by Chauncy

- NY Forward Grant The grant application was denied. However, the application made the "finals", which was rare for a first time application. There has already been a commitment to reapply (July, 2025): NY Forward (up to \$4.5 million) OR Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI - \$10 million). Those involved with Reimagine Victor grassroots group are attending a grant debrief meeting (March 3rd) in order to strengthen the application.
- The Auburn (The Residences at the Auburn Trail) They are interested in making connections with local businesses/organizations. Specifically, they are interested in VHT organized activities and volunteer opportunities. We could ask for support for the AARP grant. Scott has reached out to Angela Witty.
- Mead Square Park Bayer Landscape will soon begin its site review as well as gathering input from stakeholders.
- Simon School Letters The letter has been delivered to Hannah.
- Village Sub-Committee on Connecting the Auburn Trail to the Village of Victor Next step: prepare gathered data for a presentation/discussion with the Village Board of Trustees
- Fundraising Strategies (pages 26-28 of the SVC Victor Hiking Trails recommendations):
 There are specific strategies and businesses listed. Also, grant opportunities (Golisano).
 It looks like it would make sense to integrate these recommendations and strategies into our goal sub-committee work.
